Minister's Report

The year 2025 was a significant moment in the life of the United Church of Canada, as we celebrated its 100th anniversary. This centennial invited us to remember the faithful, courageous, and innovative ministries that have shaped our church, even as we continue to live in a time of uncertainty and challenge. I am deeply grateful that Grace United Church was able to participate in this celebration in our own meaningful ways—through the GUC 100 Tables Project and the UCW Centennial Celebration worship service. More importantly, we continued to live out our calling of “*Love in Action*” by sharing God’s love with our wider community through ministries such as the Medical Transportation Service, the After-school Youth Café, the Door of Hope, the Homeplate Shelter Coalition, the Emergency Support Fund, and the many quiet acts of service our members offer throughout the week.

The year 2025 also felt special to me personally, as it marked my 7th year of ministry at GUC since beginning in 2019. I am truly thankful to be on this journey of faith together with you. After returning from my sabbatical in 2024, my primary focus in 2025 was on “*Transformative Worship*.” Through changes in the order of service and new worship experiments, I sought to nurture worship as a well-spring of joy, energy, and spiritual renewal—strengthening us as disciples who follow the way of Jesus and share God’s love in action. I remain open and grateful for your feedback, ideas, and suggestions as we continue to grow together.

As we step into 2026, I sense a strong call to deepen one of our ministry priorities: “*Inclusive Family*.” This work will invite us to strengthen communication, build relationships with new families, engage in adult confirmation, continue our journey toward becoming an Affirming congregation and deepen our commitments to Truth and Reconciliation, and explore creative and flexible uses of our church building and worship space.

The following summary highlights my ministry work in 2025:

Worship service:

- Prepared and led regular Sunday worship services, along with special services for occasions such as Good Friday, the Hymn Singing Gathering (Sept 25), and Christmas Eve. YouTube livestreaming and on-demand worship video options were made available.
- Delivered weekly printed copies of the Sunday service—including prayers and sermons—to seniors who are homebound and do not have email access (currently supporting approximately 9 individuals).
- Administered the Sacrament of Communion three times during the year (Easter, Church Picnic, and Thanksgiving).
- Conducted Sunday worship services at the Northwest Community Lodge at 3:00 p.m. approximately once a month, including a Memorial Service (Nov 23) for residents who had passed away.

Pastoral Care & Administration:

- Maintained communication with church members through phone calls, emails, and text messages.
- Conducted in-person visits to homes, hospitals, and long-term care facility.
- Officiated funerals for Bernice Peters (Jan 3), Carole Doll (Jun 13, Interment Aug 16), Erma Cornish (Jun 27), Don Grigo (July 12), and Hugh Blachford (Aug 2).
- Conducted the baptism of Elsie & Asher Roy on May 11.
- Created and distributed a weekly email newsletter and regularly updated the church website, Facebook page, and YouTube channel. I am grateful for the support of our new church secretary, Rachael Carbert, who has shared these administrative responsibilities since beginning her role in October.
- Prepared and submitted grant applications for the GUC Medical Transportation Ministry: 1) Federal Government *New Horizons for Seniors Program* (submitted Sept 16; in process); 2) UCC Rural Ministry – *CiRCLe M Grant* (submitted Nov 12; \$4,000 approved); 3) Innovation Credit Union Community Grant (submitted Dec 23; in process).
- Participated in committee meetings, including Worship & Membership, Christian Education, Ministry & Personnel, Trustee, Support & Care, New Space Team, and Official Board.

Christian Education:

- Facilitated the Graceland Youth Café (Tue–Fri, 3:30–5:00 p.m. during the school season; averaging 10–15 students daily) with Christine Beckett, Part-time Coordinator, and adult volunteers who supported kitchen and activity duties. Began using the former Masons’ Room as the regular Youth Café space.
- Organized Graceland Youth Café activities, including Movie Days (Feb 19 and Nov 12) and a Bowling Trip (Apr 24) during the school break.
- Prepared and facilitated a Lenten Bible study, *Reading the First Nations Version of the New Testament*, held on Mar 9, Mar 23, Apr 6, Apr 13.

- Collaborated with the Christian Education Committee to organize the Graceland Youth Café Fundraiser Night (May 10) and Summer VBS (Aug 19–21; 37 kids, 8 youth leaders, 23 adult volunteers).
- Facilitated Adult Confirmation for two members through seven sessions (Dec 2025–Mar 2026), using the UCC resource *Building God's Beloved Community* (2022), in preparation for Easter celebration on Apr 5, 2026.

Community Outreach:

- Volunteered with the Community Meal at the Door of Hope and with the GUC Medical Transportation Service ministry.
- Served as a Board member of the ML Homeplate Shelter Coalition Corp., participating in Board meetings, managing social media operations, and assisting with grant applications and fundraiser activities.
- Attended ML Pride in the Park and offered the Opening Prayer on June 29.
- Organized the *UCC 100 Tables GUC Project* at the Aquatic Centre on Aug 20, including public swimming sponsorship.
- Supported the Good News International (GNI) Ministries Community Triathlon Fundraiser through safety volunteer work on Aug 23 (with Rob & Moira, Diane & George, Jean Wilson).
- Joined a carol-singing visit to the Northwest Friendship Centre Christmas Party on Dec 10.
- Utilized GUC's Emergency Fund to assist individuals with grocery gift cards, food, and overnight hotel stays.

- Participated in the Prairie Candidacy Board, including in-person meetings (Mar 12–14 in St. Albert; Oct 14–18 in Toronto) and monthly online meetings.

- Served on the UCC Korean Network Leadership Team and participated in the General Meeting and UCC Centennial Celebration (May 13–15, Toronto).
- Acted as Pastoral Charge Supervisor for Kerrobert United Church.
- Participated in the UCC General Council 45 online sessions (Jun 22 and 28; Sept 13) and onsite sessions (Aug 7–11 in Calgary) with George and Diane Thurlow.

We are sharing God's love with the world through worship, church groups, providing medical transportation, Graceland Youth Café, support of Homeplate Shelter, Lodge Services, the Emergency Fund, Vacation Bible Schools, yard sales, fall suppers, serving meals at the Door of Hope, singing Christmas carols for the NW Friendship Christmas Celebration.....

We have this ministry and we are not discouraged; it is by God's own power that we may live and serve. Thanks be to God!

Outreach Report

Our committee seems to grow in popularity each year. The good name of Grace United Church is certainly becoming well known throughout the community. All because of the generosity of YOU, our members.

- **FOOD BANK:** We delivered over 180 pounds of food items to the Door of Hope this past year.
- **WHITE GIFT SUNDAY:** A total of 98 mitts, 30 toques, 6 scarves were delivered to the schools in Meadow Lake and Flying Dust First Nation.
- **WASKOOSIS WOMENS SHELTER:** received a large donation of toys and mittens, and women feminine products delivered year-round.
- **ANGEL TREE GIFTS:** Gifts were delivered to 8 children in three communities. We would like to thank our generous sponsors, Church members and Meadow Lake Minor Hockey (they donated quite a large amount and there were extra gifts for all children).
- **DOOR OF HOPE;** Outreach has covered the cost of the meat, plus helped serve during the meal.
- **BEREAVMENT CARDS;** We continue to acknowledge our church family members who have lost loved ones.
- **STUDENTS ATTENDING SCHOOL AWAY FROM HOME;** Care packages continue to be delivered.
- **HOMELESS SHELTER/2ND STAGE HOUSING;** A financial contribution was provided to the Shelter and from the generosity of one of the transported medical patients, 6 large bags of new and slightly used clothing has been given to the clients of 2nd Stage Housing. We are also supporting 2nd Stage Housing by employing someone within the program to shovel snow from Grace United Church's sidewalks.
- **MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION:** This program continues to grow in popularity. Since the implementation in 2019, we have made 314 trips; driven 144,305 kms; donated 2,468 volunteer hours of driving; and have received \$12,277 in donations for the church. (The donations only represent the last 5 yrs of being recorded since George took over the accounting in 2021). There were other donations given directly to the church. Our number of active volunteer drivers now stands at 8. We have lost 3 drivers this past year. Our trips have been averaging 2 /per week over the last few months. We were unsuccessful in the Federal Government Grant for \$25k. However, we were successful in receiving \$4K in funding from CiRCLe M Project Seed and another \$10k from Mission & Service National Office. We also applied for the \$25k funding through Innovation Credit Union but were unsuccessful.
- **CAROL SINGING:**
 - at the Hospital was cancelled due to the FLU. Thanks to those who were willing to participate.
 - Also, a big thank you to those who attended the NW Friendship Centre Christmas Party, at the Civic centre, to sing Christmas carols.

Grace United Church has an Emergency Fund which can provide help to persons in immediate need. Donations to this Fund can be made at anytime and by writing "Emergency Fund" on your offering envelope. The Fund is administered by the minister.

Christian Education Committee

This team consists of some dedicated, energetic, and inspiring leaders including Carol Zacharias, Tracy Roy, Monica Koller, SunDo Hyun, Wilf Henke, Annette Gratton, Christine Beckett and myself. Thank you, team, for supporting me and getting fully involved with Christian Education planning. This is a hardworking group with lots of enthusiasm and fun ideas for education and activities in our church community. We have met on 6 occasions with a few extra ad hoc small team meetings to plan Graceland Cafe fundraiser and VBS.

Sunday School consists of a flexible 1 room multiage class and a free-spirited nursery. The multiage classroom has between 2-10 attendees with about 22 individual children in total. Curriculum is usually found online, and I have tried to incorporate the 7 wisdom teachings to compare similarities and comparisons of biblical faith. I am supported by other teachers including, Rob and Moira Tether, Carol Zacharias, Tracy Roy, JinSun Hyun, and Aimee Seguin. Thank you to all who make attending church and Sunday School a fun and activity for the children. Ask them about what they are learning and check out the display board by the kitchen. June 1st was presentation Sunday and we presented several attendance certificates along with bibles for those grade 6 graduates and celebrated with 4 grade 12 grads associated with our church over the years and including JinHa. Congratulations to all!

Dec 14th was white gift service and the children's pageant followed by potluck lunch and a movie. The pageant was well participated, and I think everyone had lots of fun.

VBS was a big success with more than 35 children attending and an additional 8 youth team leaders who demonstrated some great leadership skills. Thanks go out to the many volunteers: supporting the activity through donations, kitchen planning and prep., helping with decorating, music, registration, science, craft, story telling and recreation activities. Thanks especially to the planning team of Isabelle, George, Tracy, Carol, Monica and SunDo. This year we also sponsored the public swim for one afternoon which I believe was a success, especially as the weather was cloudy and all our VBS children appeared to have great fun.

Also, at this public swim event the CE team participated in the 100 Tables event, with a table in the pool entrance, sharing some of GUC's activities, especially youth activities.

Graceland Cafe continues to be providing a service to many children after school. Christine co-ordinates this with food and activities supported by many volunteers. There are between 10 and 18 children attending on a regular basis. Thank you to all who support the cafe in any way it couldn't work without you.

We once again CE planned a concert fundraiser with musical and comedic talents and bucket raffle. Thank you for making this a huge success with your donations, attendance and support.

As part of the Grace Ignited suggestions for more intergenerational services we planned and coordinated an all-ages service November 30th for SunDo's 5th Sunday away.

Ted talks continue followed by lunch and discussion at the end of the month. This year we have alternated months with a family movie activity as well.

Lenten bible studies were led by SunDo using the Indigenous Bible which was very interesting in its interpretation of the standard bible from a more living story telling perspective.

Door of Hope community meals continue, although not a direct responsibility of the CE team. 5 meals have been prepared and served, attendance is increasing since the summer again and 95 meals were served at our Dec 29th meal. This continues to be a needed service in our community and a way we can share with those less fortunate. The way Jesus taught us to love and care for others. We always comment on how everyone is so appreciative. Again, thank you to all who support this activity in donations and time and participation.

Again, my thanks go out to this team, you are a great group to work with and make this fun. To the congregation – thank you for supporting the work of the CE team and if you want to join us, we'd love to have you. Also, if you have more ideas that you feel we could organise and participate in for the benefit of the church family please let us know.

UNI-MAS Property Management Committee

In 2025, this joint committee met in Jan, March and May. There were seven representatives for the Church and three for the Masonic Lodge. The members from the Church were Gladys Wood, Marvel Blachford, Bill Hart, Jean Wilson, Joanne Pethick, Hilda Gibson and Barry Gibson. The members from the Masonic Lodge were George Wood, Bob Wilson and Cliff Orriss.

This committee was responsible for the insurance, care, maintenance and repair of the jointly owned building. Operational and maintenance costs were shared, the Church 75% and the Masonic Lodge 25%. The Church received the hall rental fees. George Wood kept the financial records and paid the accounts.

- The Church hall rental rates for 2025 were increased to \$75 for morning, \$75 for afternoon and \$75 for evenings. Hall rental income for 2025 was \$3815 (16 events).
- Approved the installation of a separate power circuit to the new photocopier in the Church office, as there was an electrical overload. Work done by Keith Bohme and his electrician friend (Material & Labour donated by Keith).
- To prevent flooding and freezing of drain water from center downspout on the south side of the Church, Double D Contracting was contracted to replace existing eaves-trough, eliminate center downspout and slope away from center. Cost - \$1831. Funds came from the Sheila Hart Fund.
- Our two fire extinguishers were checked, one was recharged and the other was replaced.

A special thanks to all our volunteers who looked after the flowers, decorating, grass cutting, janitorial, maintenance and all others who cared for our building and property.

With Grace United Church purchase of Masonic Lodge portion of the building, 100% of the maintenance, repairs and insurance and now the responsibility of GUC and there is no longer the need for this joint committee. (A new Church committee has been formed). Our joint committee's last official meeting was May 22, 2025 when a motion was made to close the books after 31 years. Chairman Barry Gibson thanked his committee members for their service. Bob Wilson then thanked George, Gladys, Hilda and Barry who have served on this joint committee for its 31 years.

Treasurer's Report

To the Congregation of Grace United Church, Meadow Lake,

The following pages represent the financial picture of Grace United Church at the end of 2025, with a comparison to our position in 2024. In 2025 we saw the inclusion of the Medical Transportation Program into the general finances of the Church. We also saw the closure of the Northern Light Masonic Lodge in June and the loss of their 25% support on the operational expenses of the Church. At our February meeting where we approved the Church's 2025 Operational Budget, I thought there was no hope of getting close to that level of revenue support. But we did very well, with only a shortfall of \$2640. Expenses for the year were, \$257,808, while Revenues were \$255,168.

As in previous years, Grace United Church has strength in our financial processes/procedures through a detailed segregation of duties. The weekly envelope offering is counted by Barry and Hilda Gibson. Barry deposits the offering into the Innovation Credit Union (ICU) who recounts and verifies the deposit. At month end the ICU bank statement is transferred into the Church's "Sage Accounting" software by Rachael Carbert with support from Monica Koeller. At that time there is also a reconciliation of the e-transfers and PAR offerings, as well as the cheques that have been written on the account. On a monthly basis the expenses are paid by Bob Wilson and Rachael Carbert. The signing authority for cheques is currently held by Joanne Gislason (Chair of the Official Board), Bob Wilson (Treasurer), and Rachael Carbert (Secretary). Two of the three must endorse a cheque. It is this separation of duties that provides the congregation with the knowledge of financial regularity. On a final note, the presentation of the following pages is provided with the generous assistance of Isabelle Opikokew, whose knowledge of accounting cannot be overstated. My personal thanks is expressed to the above people for their assistance in the financial processes of Grace United Church.

For the coming year we have prepared a budget for 2026 of \$193,389.

It is only through the consistent financial support of the congregation and adherents to Grace United Church that this target may be realized.





Living Skies Regional Representative, Meadow Lake, 2025 Annual Report

I attended the General Council meeting in August in Calgary with George and SunDo. All expenses, travel, motel, and meals were paid by the General Council. George gave a General Council report to Meadow Lake, and the 2 pastoral charges that we supervise: Northern Lakes and Turtle River Parish.

The Meadow Lake Board has been very busy this year as the other committee reports show. At the end of the year the Board updated the 3year assessment of the church's life and work coordinated by Bob Wilson.

The Wednesday weekly Regional Rambler is now being distributed to all Board members. Thanks to Bob Wilson of doing this.

I missed one meeting in September because I attended as co-chair of the Saskatchewan United Church of Canada Women the National United Church Women's Annual meeting in Mississauga Ontario.

George is on the Living Skies Regional Council Property Commission. They oversee land transactions as churches disband or at least restructure. They are disbanding a congregation a month as rural depopulation combines with general decline. So far, they have been able to or give away derelict buildings and not be faced with the 10's of Thousands of dollars to demolish a building not to mention the public relations fallout.

We have 39 Cemeteries associated with disbanded churches which we are trying to get Municipalities to take over. In the meantime, they are trying for insurance especially against some vandals starting a fire which spreads.

George is also Chair of Finance for ST Andrew's college and on the board of the Saskatoon Theological Union which coordinate theological education between the UC the Anglicans and the Lutherans. No college is large enough to offer a full compliment of classes or have classes large enough to have good discussion, so they are increasing their level of Cooperation
